- + Chaste size dividers
- Squeezy cheese tubes
- + Labels from other Cathadral City rets products or from other brands of mini ch



THE CONFECTIONERY **RECYCLING PROGRAMME**

ACCEPTED WASTE

All brands of plastic conflectionery packaging are accepted in the programme, examples of which can be seen below



Waste that is NOT accepted

- · Breakfast, granols and energy ber wrappers
- Alumenium foil, cardboard and paper wrappers. For example: individual foil and paper
 packets (like ROWINTREE'S' Fruit Passilies or KITKAT' Biscuits) and cardboard tubes and
 boxes (like SMARTIES' or AFTER EIGHT') are not accepted in this programme. These can be recycled via local council facilities.
- Metal bris and riod plastic travis or tubs. For example, QUALITY STREET plastic tubs or DAIRY BOX" chocolete box peckaging are not accepted in this programme. These can be recycled via local council facilities.
- · GUALITY STREET/ wrappers as these are biodegradable via home composing



The recycling from these bins will raise money for the Oak and Furrows RSPCA.
