We have been learning about Maps!

The Reception children used maps to save the Gingerbread man. The children found a map and followed the directions carefully to find the mischievous Gingerbread Man stuck in one of the trees! The children were very good at identifying places on the map such as the pirate ship and the train on the Reception playground.

Year One children have been using directions to describe the position of different places in and around school and have been introduced to the compass points to support their descriptions.
