Maths

We will be learning all about 2d (flat)



and 3d (solid) shapes. We will be learning to identify the shapes and describe their features. We will also be practicing number facts of numbers up to 10 and using the day of Bob to help us learn to tell the time for o'clock and half past. Does your child

have a watch? We will be finishing the term learning about position and direction which will help us to find those easter eggs!



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Science

We will continue to investigate materials and even receive an exciting visit from the space dome this term!

Art and DT

We will be using the story of Beegu to create paintings and 3d clay models of the character. We will investigate the painter Van Gogh and his painting Starry Night and create our own Easter crafts and greeting cards.

Computing

We will continue to use Purple Mash for our learning this term and use it to make our own eBooks and to investigate coding.

Music

The children will be given opportunities to play instruments and listen to a varied selection of music played by famous composers.

Geography

We will be pretending we are an alien and viewing our planet from space using satellite images. We will be locating the continents, oceans, countries in the UK and the capital city of each country. We will then be visiting our high street to identify and explain the human and physical geography we can see.

PSHE (Personal, Social,


Health Education)
