

English

we will start our topic by completing some nonfiction writing about Ernest Shackleton including creating a timeline. We will create poems for the 'Animal Railway' and write fact files for famous landmarks. This term we will learn about prefixes and suffixes which is a letter or group of letters added to the beginning (prefix) or end of a root word (suffix).

Science

We will learn how to grow plant and how to keep them healthy. We will also look at Botanist, Carl Linnaeus.

History

Alongside our learning on Ernest Shackleton, we will learn about Amelia Earhart

RE

This term we will look at the church as a special place for Christians.

Music

The children will create their own compositions using different instruments.

Maths

First we will learn to adding and subtracting within 10, including near doubles. Then we will learn about the place value of teen numbers including placing them on a number line and identifying odd and even numbers.

Finally we will be learning all about 3D shapes and recap our work on capacity.

Art

Our Art will focus on drawing skills using illustrations from 'Shackleton's Journey'. We will create models of aeroplanes using different materials and layered artwork on the Eiffel Tower.

PSHE

We will look at being healthy and having a healthy mind with a focus of sleep and screen time.

Please ensure your child wears their PE kit in on Tuesdays and brings in their kit on a Thursday and that all clothing is labelled.


