## English



We will be using the a range of books that have friends and family as their theme.: 'Elmer', 'Mog the Forgetful cat' and 'The Scarecrow's Wedding.' The children

will use these stories to write labels, character descriptions and shopping lists.

The children will start to learn about word classes looking at nouns and adjectives to describe and label items. We will be looking more at the alphabet and ordering words in alphabetical order. Our sentence writing will focus on full stops, capital letters and finger space.

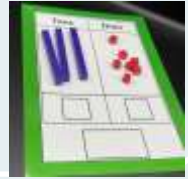


## Maths

We will start by embedding previous reception maths experiences by exploring counting and pattern.



We will then move on to place value to 100. This will involve lots of counting and learning that making groups of 10 means we can count objects more reliably. The children will also be learning about number lines and the value of numbers, using practical resources to demonstrate their place value using the language of tens and ones .



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## Science

We will be learning about our bodies and keeping healthy. This includes focusing on keeping clean, brushing teeth and making healthy choices with our food and drink. We will also be exploring outside to investigate the season of Autumn.

## Art and DT

After completing our self portraits we will be creating our family portrait. We will use pattern and colour mixing to make art work inspired by Elmer. We will be designing and making scarecrow biscuits for the Scarecrow's wedding reception in DT.



## Computing

We will be learning how to keep safe online and revisit using Chrome books.

## Geography

We will start by labelling a simple plan of our classrooms, then move on to learning the compass points, drawing a map of our school as well as parts of Wootton Bassett.

## PSHE (Personal, Social, Health Education)

During our PSHE lessons we will be learning about staying safe at school, online and at home.

## RE- Religious Education

We will focus on kindness and learn about stories from different religions about being kind. We will think of ways we can be kind.

## Music

We will be learning Harvest songs and about Hip-Hop rhythms in Music.
