
Out of This World

and poems. We will also be writing instructions on how we would catch a star. We will be looking at Neil Armstrong and creating a fact file about his life, this will include watching clips of




the moon landing and hear those very famous words!

Maths


We will start the term by looking at 2D and 3D shapes. We will investigate patterns and some properties these shapes



We will then move on to learning about odd and even numbers to help us

count in steps of 2. We will begin placing numbers on a number line to understand the value of numbers. We will use part part whole models to help partition numbers.

Continuing to talk in full sentences will help aid our mathematical understanding.
