English

We will begin our topic by writing about our half term. We will introduce our key text for the term 'The Secret Garden'. We will be



writing about our own gardens and writing descriptions of settings in the book as well as writing about the characters and retelling the story. This term we will learn about the prefix un, which is a



group of letters added to the beginning of a root word (unlock). We will also be learning to use the suffix ed and ing.

Maths

We will begin our maths learning by learning our doubles to 20 and how we can use number

bonds to 10 to help us with addition and subtraction facts to 20. We will be learning all about coins and money and using these to





help us count in twos, fives and tens. We will finish the year by learning about time, focussing on o'clock and half past times and

also position and direction. Does your child have a watch?

This term our focus will be plants. The children will explore the parts of a plant and their functions, and begin identifying common British plants and trees.
