## Homework, spelling, reading...

- <u>Reading card</u>: record all reading, children can write in it. We appreciate parents signing to confirm that children are reading at home.
- Spelling: Set weekly. A mix of words that children are working on in school, words from the tricky word list and words that they are spelling incorrectly in independent writing.
- Homework: some weeks the children will be given a task relating to their topic, or maths, spelling and reading.

## Special Educational Needs/Disabilities (SEND)

- At Noremarsh we ensure that all children achieve to the best of their ability, however, sometimes children need a little bit of help with their learning.
- Your child may have been highlighted at Wootton Bassett Infants as having Special Educational Needs (SEN), and if this is the case, our SEN Co-ordinator, Mrs Ballinger, will have already liaised with the teachers and support staff at the infants to understand their needs and current support – and is busy planning provision and support for them when they arrive at Noremarsh.

# How are learners supported at Noremarsh?

- TA in each class
- Specific and targeted interventions to boost or 'catch-up' learning
- Alternative methods of recording, including use of ICT such as speech-to-text.
- Use of 'concrete' materials in maths
- Targeted work on specific skills (as set out on their individual plans of support)
- Access to ICT or specialist equipment
- Access to our Emotional Literacy Support Assistant (ELSA)
- Referral and advice from Specialist SEN Service (SSENS), Speech and Language Therapy and Educational Psychologist, or other relevant outside agencies.

#### Text messages



teachers2parents

- We use 'Teachers2Parents', the same system used by Wootton Bassett Infants.
- Newsletters are sent out via a link in a text.
- Text messages are also used to inform you of other events and changes, e.g. if a club needs to be cancelled, etc.





- ParentPay is used for all payments to school, for example, school trips and uniform.
- We prefer payments to school to be made using ParentPay where possible, however we are still able to accept cheques and cash.

#### Newsletters

- Parents are sent a text link to the newsletter which is placed on the school website.
- Newsletters contain details of class trips, class achievements, up and coming events, sports news, etc.
- Old newsletters are still on the website should you wish to look.

### Absence

- If your child is absent from school due to unexpected illness please let us know as soon as possible.
- If your child is not in school and we have not heard in advance, then we will contact you to ascertain their whereabouts in order to maintain their safety.

## Leave of Absence

- We do not accept leave of absence requests during term time unless there is an exceptional reason for doing so.
- If you know that your child will be absent from school, i.e. for a medical appointment or another unavoidable reason, please inform us before their absence by completing a 'Leave of Absence' form. These are available in the foyer of school or by contacting the office.

## Health

Parents are notified when health checks and immunisations, such as flu, are taking place. Virgin Care will send us details of how parents can opt in and out of these prior to them being administered.

## **Changes to Contact Details**

- Our communication with you relies on you keeping us up to date with changes to your phone numbers, email and home addresses.
- Please ensure that school is informed of any changes.

## Keeping us up to date

- As well as keeping school up to date with changes in contact details, it is also helpful to know about any changes that may potentially affect your child in school.
- Children can be affected quite significantly by some incidents, such as the goldfish being ill, and knowing can help us to support them.

## Snacks



At break time children are encouraged to eat a healthy, litter-free snack. We are a 'nut free' school.

Children need their own water bottle into school each day. These can be refilled throughout the day, but need to be taken home daily for washing.

## Lunchtimes



- Children can either have a school lunch provided by Dolce (the same company used by Wootton Bassett Infant School) or a packed lunch.
- Dinners are ordered via Dolce's website.
- At Key Stage 2, dinners are no longer free. If you feel your child qualifies for free school meals then please contact the school office.
- Packed lunches need to be nut free. We encourage the children to eat a healthy lunch. Water is provided as a drink and fizzy drinks are not allowed.
