#### Farewell to Mr Hazzard

Whilst the summer holidays are usually a cause for excitement, this year there is more than a touch of sadness too as the end of term means that the time has come to say goodbye to Mr Hazzard, who is heading off to enjoy a well-deserved retirement after a long and successful teaching career, the last 14 years of which have been as Headteacher at our school.

Mr Hazzard's passion for art and all things creative have been at the heart of everything at the school during his time here and has been fundamental in creating a warm, fun and exciting environment in which our pupils can thrive and enjoy their time at school.

It's difficult to put into words just how much of an impact Mr Hazzard has had on so many people's lives and since he announced that he would be retiring this summer, we have been blown away by the number of pupils and colleagues – past and present – who have been in contact to share their stories and memories. I wanted to share just a few of these which I think sum up the sentiment behind all of the comments we've received perfectly:

I always knew when he'd taught my daughters; they'd come home very happy and covered in paint! Enjoy your retirement Mr Hazzard, you will be missed! X"

"I was lucky enough to be taught by Mr Hazzard at Windmill Hill. I am now 27 and when I look back he is the one teacher I really remember with really happy school memories. The passion and the care he put into what he taught was incredible and he knew perfectly just how he really could teach us through a fun and valuable way. Every learning moment was a fun one and that is why I remember him so fondly."

I also remember a class trip to the book shop & when we got there, he was ready & waiting to read a story to the children, they loved it. Overall we just feel lucky that our children attended Infants & were nurtured & developed by Mark and his team. We wish you a wonderfully happy & healthy retirement Mark, you deserve it! "



Mr Hazzard will be hugely missed by all of the pupils and staff at the school. His passion for art and creativity and determination to do the best for every child are now embedded at the core of the schools values and the whole team are determined to carry this forward for many years to come – a legacy that Mr Hazzard can feel very proud of.

Both gates will be opened at 8.50am, with school starting by 9am. If you arrive after 9am you will need to buzz at the main entrance (middle gate) for entry/

Parents will stand in the playground with their child until the teacher or TA collects them. If you have a child in both year groups, please drop your Reception child off first and then bring your Year 1 or 2 child to the lower playground thereafter.

At the end of the day the gates will be opened at 2:50pm, please wait on the play and the children will be dismissed from their classrooms. Again, if you have children in both year groups, please collect your Reception child first.



#### School Office

#### School Dinners

All our children are entitled to a meal at lunchtime. These are provided by Dolce and can be ordered through School Grid. Existing parents can continue using their existing log in. Any new parents should have received an email from School Grid with your log on details (this may have gone into your spam or junk). Meals must be ordered by 8.55am to ensure your child gets their choice. Any problems please speak to the school office.



Please let the school office know ASAP if you have not received this email.

Children, can of course, bring a healthy packed lunch. Any grapes, sausages or other items that could cause choking must be cut length ways.

#### Back to School Checklist

- Uniform this can be ordered from <u>Wootton Bassett Infants' School (myclothing.com</u>) or we have a small amount in school.
- Water bottle Children will need a named water bottle in school every day.
- PE Kit All children will take part in PE lessons both indoor and outdoor. Therefore they will need t-shirt, shorts, leggings or jogging trousers, a jumper or hoody and a pair of trainers or well fitted daps.
- Long hair should be tied up and other than plain stud earrings, no other jewellery is allowed.
- Weather appropriate clothing coat, hat etc
- All children will be given a book bag, that needs to be bought to school every day

#### Medication/Inhalers

If your child has asthma and may need to use an inhaler during school time, you will need to complete a form (available from the office) and provide a copy of their Asthma care plan.

Prescribed medication can only be administered following agreement with the school nurse. We can not give children other medication but you are welcome to come in and administer it yourself.

#### Absence

If you are child is unable to attend school for any reason, you must ring or email the school by 9:30. We have a responsibility to ensure the welfare of all the children and are obviously anxious if we don't hear from you. We will ring all the contacts you have given until we are able to confirm the reason for absence.
