What is Google Classroom?

Think of Google Classroom (GC) as your child's digital link to learning.

Teachers can use GC to share tasks (assignments), homework, messages and much more with pupils.






Your child was provided with a secure login and password that is unique to them.

Check with the class teacher to obtain this private information, if not received.









Type <u>classroom.google.com</u> into your web address bar.

Tip: You can also find a direct link for each teacher's Google Classroom on the webpage for the class.






Type in your child's Google Email address & click "next."





Type in your PASSWORD and click "next."

Tip: On first use, there may be some additional steps, e.g. accepting the Terms & Conditions and selecting the user role ('Student').






Now you will see your child's class. Click to enter.




If working in Google Chrome, the task will open as a document which can be edited. **Tip**: Google files automatically save content, so there is no need to save!

(Tablet devices may need additional Google Suite apps, such as Google Docs or Slides to be installed.)





Turn in work




When complete, tasks can be 'turned in' and a comment can be shared with the teacher.
